WP5 Overview



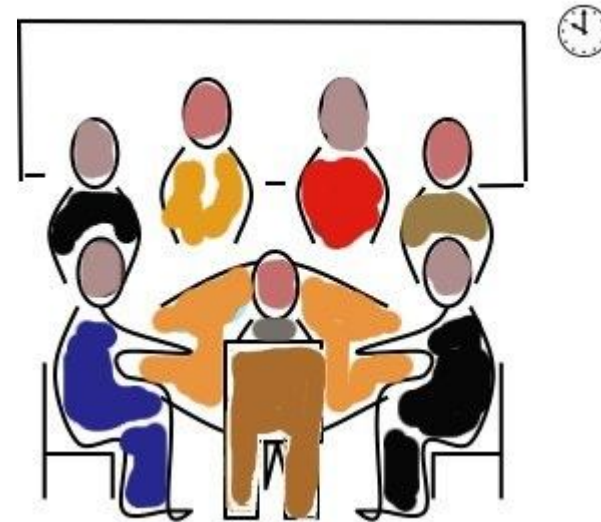
- Measures to be taken to develop capabilities to implement the JAP by core and associate partners through the Business Plan

- We propose to establish a working group for this WP consisting of 1-2 key people from the following (based on man month contributions):

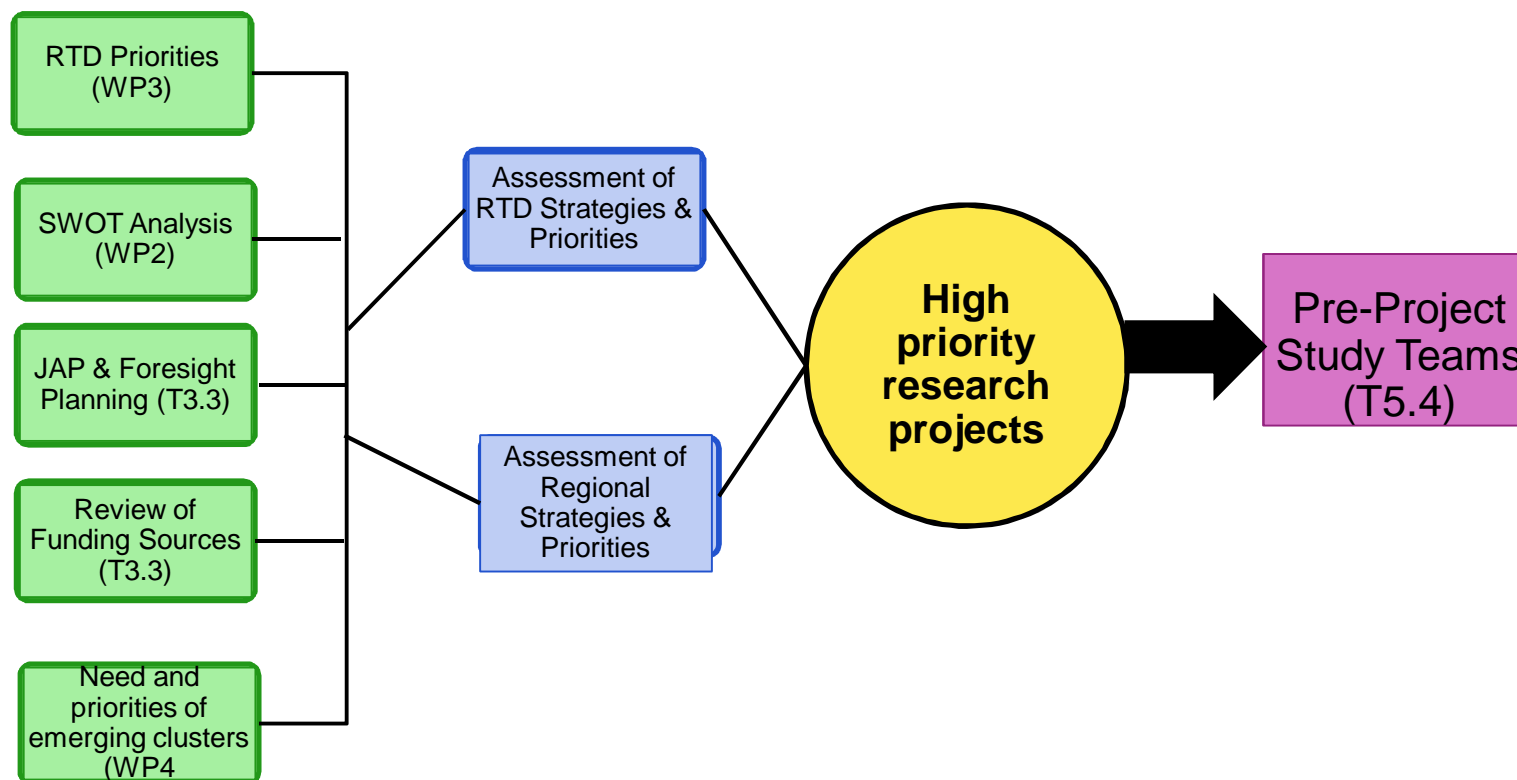
